Conference participations during the doctoral studies: Participation in conferences, posters and oral contributions if any (both presented and accepted). Attending department and institution seminars. In case you have not yet participated in any international conferences, please specify a few scientific event (with moderate expenses) in the next year in which your participation would be beneficial.

A list of further activities, summarized for the entire doctoral studies, can also be given such as, e.g.,

- *Patents:* submitted and accepted.
- *Teaching activity:* form of teaching activity (e.g., practice), specifying the title and total number of hours delivered.
- *Professional activities:* organizing conferences/schools, activities in scientific associations, tasks completed at department or institution level.
- *Awards:* scholarships, grants received .
